Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Yamhill County is a program that recruits, trains and supervises volunteers to serve as advocates for abused and neglected children in the court system.



A CASA is the voice of the child in court and also makes fact-based recommendations to the judge regarding the child's best interests. CASA volunteers are assigned one case at a time and generally spend 10-15 hours a month visiting the child and gathering information.
